On August 26th, Bideawee teamed up with Goldman Sachs and The Holy Apostles Soup Kitchen to offer free veterinary care and animal care packages to New York's pet-parent homeless population. Bideawee worked with the Soup Kitchen to promote the event, and people came from as far as Philadelphia to take advantage of the free services. Bideawee corporate volunteer group, Goldman Sachs, assembled the care packages, and on-staff veterinarian, Dr. Shian Simms, conducted the on-site health exams.

It's been deduced that 5 to 10 percent of New York's homeless population are pet-parents, yet New York's homeless shelters do not permit pets to enter the facilities. Many people, choosing companionship over shelter, are forced to live on the streets, which can lead to a variety of health concerns for them and their pets. As an organization committed to the relationship between pets and people, Bideawee was proud to be able to offer care and support to these beloved pets, and to their owners. 
Ask Mike Rueb, CPDT (Certified Pet Dog Trainer)



Nova & Alula (Adopted by Emily Estefan)- A Family Affair


