
# **Bideawee's Puppies Shine at Annual Broadway Barks Event!**

## Long-term Bideawee Supporters Find New Ways to Give Back

Anoop Punjabi and Gail Cook have been steadfast Bideawee supporters for many years and are always looking for additional ways to give back to the organization. They are Animal Hospital clients, donors and members of <u>Bideawee's Flora Kibbe Society</u>, which recognizes those who have named Bideawee in their estate plans. Anoop and Gail care deeply about the organization, and take every opportunity to raise awareness and funds for the animals in Bideawee's care.

Anoop is a real estate professional and one of the founding members of an organization called REBSEA (Real Estate & Business Social Enterprises Association), a 501(c)6 Nonprofit Trade Association with members donating a substantial part of their commission to a selected non-profit organization. Anoop also donates 20% of his net commission to the organization, when a <u>Bideawee supporter employs his services to buy, sell or lease any property</u>.

Additionally, both Gail & Anoop are members of ResQwalk, a free mobile app that raises money and resources for animal welfare organizations by simply tracking the distance walked. To date, more than \$120,000 along with more than \$23,000 in pet related products have been distributed to various organizations by ResQwalk. Anoop and Gail don't only take it upon themselves to support the organization; they spread the word, encouraging friends and family to take up the cause! They have already recruited several friends who are using the ResQwalk app on behalf of Bideawee, and they show no signs of slowing down their efforts. We are so fortunate for their continuous support and we thank them for everything they do to improve the lives of homeless animals.


## Come and Get Your Love - Bideawee on the Radio
